THE PROJECTS

The "Ciclopista del Trammino" bike lane, which allowed the recovery of the eponymous ancient railroad track, connects the municipality of Cascina and the City of Pisa to the sea, linking together places of national interest and relevance such as the Cisanello Hospital, Pisa International Airport, Pisa Central Railway Station, the intermodal train-bus-bike hub.

The Bicycle Superhighway connecting the cities of Florence and Prato is the first case in Italy of high-capacity cycling infrastructure, designed primarily to meet the mobility needs of commuters (workers and students), as well as those of occasional users and tourists. It is projected to develop in an east-west direction for more than 13 km; an articulated comb system of bicycle paths will connect onto the main axis, linking the towns of the Florentine Plain: Sesto Fiorentino, Calenzano, Campi Bisenzio, Signa, Carmignano, Poggio a Caiano, (for a total of 26`km approximately).

Not just bike lanes...

The Save my bike project, a finalist in the 2018 edition of the European Commission's Regiostars competition, uses technology to promote sustainable mobility by incentivizing the use of bicycles in the city through theft prevention; the idea is to install a device that allows the competent authorities to identify each bicycle and notify to the owner when it is found.
